### Trout Run Day Camp

For decades, youth in the Trout Run area have enjoyed a week long day camp at Susque run by the Lewis Township Recreation Commission. Susque staff are thrilled at the opportunity to serve the local community by continuing this tradition. Thanks to a variety of corporate and individual sponsors, Trout Run Day Camp continues to be free for local campers.

Day campers can expect to be challenged to grow physically (swimming, archery, hiking), mentally (crafts, social engagement), and spiritually (chapel, Bible study, Christian counseling staff) during their time here.

Susque staff have undergone 2 weeks of orientation to care, to the best of their abilities, for the physical, spiritual, and emotional needs of your camper. Any aquatic activity in the pool or creek will be supervised by certified Red Cross lifeguards.







## Daily Packing List

### **Health & Wellness**

### **HEALTH FORM**

The online registration includes a required health form for your camper. This form must be filled out prior to camp. The form will ask for a short health history, prescription medications, allergies, over the counter medication permissions, and general permission to treat within our staff's scope of care.

### PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION

Medications that must be administered during the camp day must be noted on the camper's health form. Please bring the daily dosage to drop off each day in a labeled, sealed plastic baggie and turn into Susque staff. Campers should not carry the medication themselves.

### YOU WILL BE CALLED IF...

- A camper's illness or injury exceeds reasonable first aid measures
- Your camper has a tick bite
- Your camper is unfit to continue camp programming with reasonable accomodations







## **Expectations**of Behavior

### CAMPER CODE OF CONDUCT

Please discuss the Camper Code of Conduct found on the following page with your camper prior to camp. Susque staff will further clarify and communicate more site specific rules and expectations with campers at the start of the week.

### **BEHAVIOR CORRECTION**

In the event that a camper is unable to follow expectations, a counselor will stop the action and repeat or further clarify the expectation. If the behavior persists, the counselor may withhold participation in the next activity and alert the Head Counselor or director.

If the counselor and camper are unable to resolve the behavior, the head counselor or director will step in to determine the best course of action moving forward. Parents may be notified immediately or be made aware of the behavior at pickup that afternoon.

Physical altercation will result in an immediate call to parents and parents will be asked to pick up their camper immediately. At pickup, the director and parents will discuss the viability of a return to camp for the camper for the following day.

### **GRACE AND FORGIVENESS**

Throughout the discipline process, Susque staff will maintain the safety and enjoyment of all campers. Any conflict resolution will be conducted seeking growth in the camper's understanding of grace, forgiveness, and the value of being made in the image of God. Staff will not hold a grudge or allow previous offenses to influence their love of a camper.

### Daily Schedule

### 8:30-9:00 Drop Off

Campers must be dropped off and signed in by parent or adult. No walk-ups or bike-ins.

Activity classes are age group specific and may include archery, climbing wall, crafts, BB range, hiking, nature class, and more.

### 11:30 Lunch

Campers are responsible for bringing a bag lunch each day.

### **Noon Family Group Campfires**

An opportunity for counselor and campers to discuss what was presented in morning chapel in a small group setting.

### 1:30 Pool and Other Games

#### 3:00 Thankfuls

One last small group gathering of the day to review highlights of the day.

3:30-4:00 Pickup By Approved Adult

## Drop-Offs & Pickups

### **MONDAY DROP-OFF**

At drop off Monday morning, plan for 15-20 minutes to checkin your camper. You will be refunded your \$20 deposit, review health form with staff, and receive dashboard placards to use during pickup.

### **DAILY DROP-OFF**

Each morning, campers must be signed in by an adult. Staff will be on hand to direct traffic. Campers should remain in vehicle until staff member comes to the vehicle.

### **DAILY PICKUP**

Make dashboard placard visible to staff. Your camper will be brought to the vehicle and must be signed-out with staff.

### **FRIDAY PICKUP**

Parents and families are invited to a closing program at 4:00 on Friday. The program will feature summary remarks from the camp chaplain, a photo slideshow of the week, and conclude with a hot dog roast over campfire. Camp Susque will provide hotdogs, roasting sticks, beverages, and sides for the meal.
